

Firmware Update Steps:

1



Make sure that your receiver is plugged in and connected to drivers and a video output, such as a TV or computer monitor. For the update, you'll be using the UI on your screen to complete the update.

2



Turn on your receiver. It'll say "Initializing" on your screen and on the receiver's LED display.

3



Once the receiver is powered up, your screen will show a list of music streaming services such as Pandora, Spotify, and Tidal.

(If you scroll down, you'll see the Blackfire logo!)


Hit the setup button on your remote (the little gear)




Scroll down the menu to #5 - "Hardware"
and hit ENTER

Scroll down to "Network" and hit Enter



Scroll down to “Wifi Setup” and hit ENTER




Scroll down to “Scan Networks”

The receiver will begin searching for all available networks



Once it finds all available networks, select the network you’d like to use and type in the password, using the arrows and enter buttons on your remote to navigate the keypad on your screen



Once connected to your preferred network, you should see “Status Connected” and signal strength on the screen




Head back out of the Setup menu to #7 - “Miscellaneous”

Click on “Miscellaneous”



Scroll down to “Firmware update”



Scroll down to, and click on “Update via NET”

Click “Update” on the next page

Your monitor may go black or blue during the update process

The progress of your update will appear on your screen and on the receiver’s LED display.


This may take several minutes

When the update has finished, the receiver’s LED display will say “Completed!”
Turn the receiver off and on
Congrats! You’ve successfully installed a firmware update on your Onkyo receiver!

Confirm that the Update was Successful:



Go back to the settings menu and click on #7 - “Miscellaneous”

Scroll down and click on #4 - “Firmware Update”

If the update was successful, you’ll see a note at the bottom of the screen saying that you have the latest version
